Report on the status of the pipeline for the Barbados Implementation Modalities

Summary

This document contains the report on the status of the pipeline for the Barbados Implementation Modalities, as at 3 April 2026.

Expected actions of the Board

The Board will be invited to take note of the document.

I. Introduction

1. In decision B.7/D.3, the Board requested the Secretariat to present, for each Board meeting, a status report that provides an overview of the pipeline of all funding requests submitted, including those that are not presented for consideration by the Board at that meeting and those that did not meet the criteria on eligible activities for funding.
2. The pipeline status report presents an overview of the pipeline of funding requests submitted to the FRLD under the Barbados Implementation Modalities (BIM) from 15 December 2025 to 3 April 2026. The overview includes information on geographic distribution, country group distribution and thematic distribution as well as details on the status of the pipeline. The detailed list of funding requests is presented in annex II.

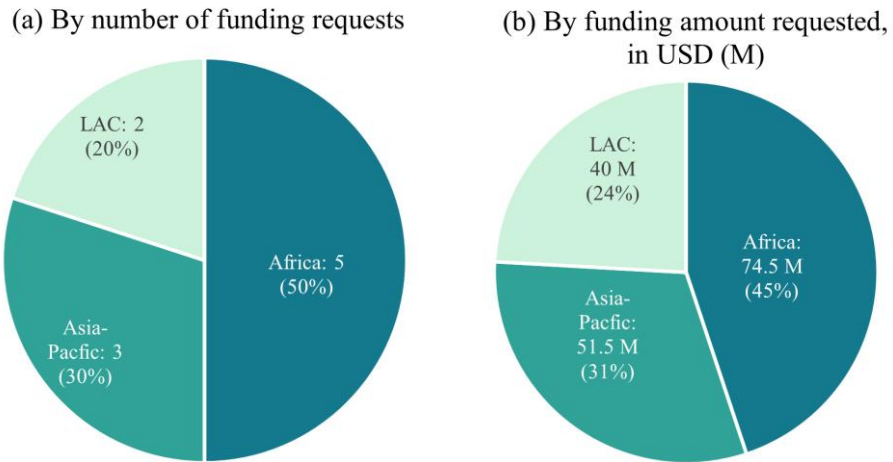
II. Overview of the pipeline

3. Since the opening of the submission for funding requests under the BIM on 15 December 2025, 10 funding requests have been received, representing a combined requested budget of USD 165.9 million. The average amount requested is approximately USD 16.6 million, with a range from USD 0.5 million to USD 20 million. The average implementation duration proposed in the funding requests is 3 years, ranging from 1.5 years to 4 years.
4. One funding request was submitted by a national ministry under the direct access via direct budget support through national governments access modality, and nine funding requests were submitted in partnership with access entities.

A. Geographic distribution

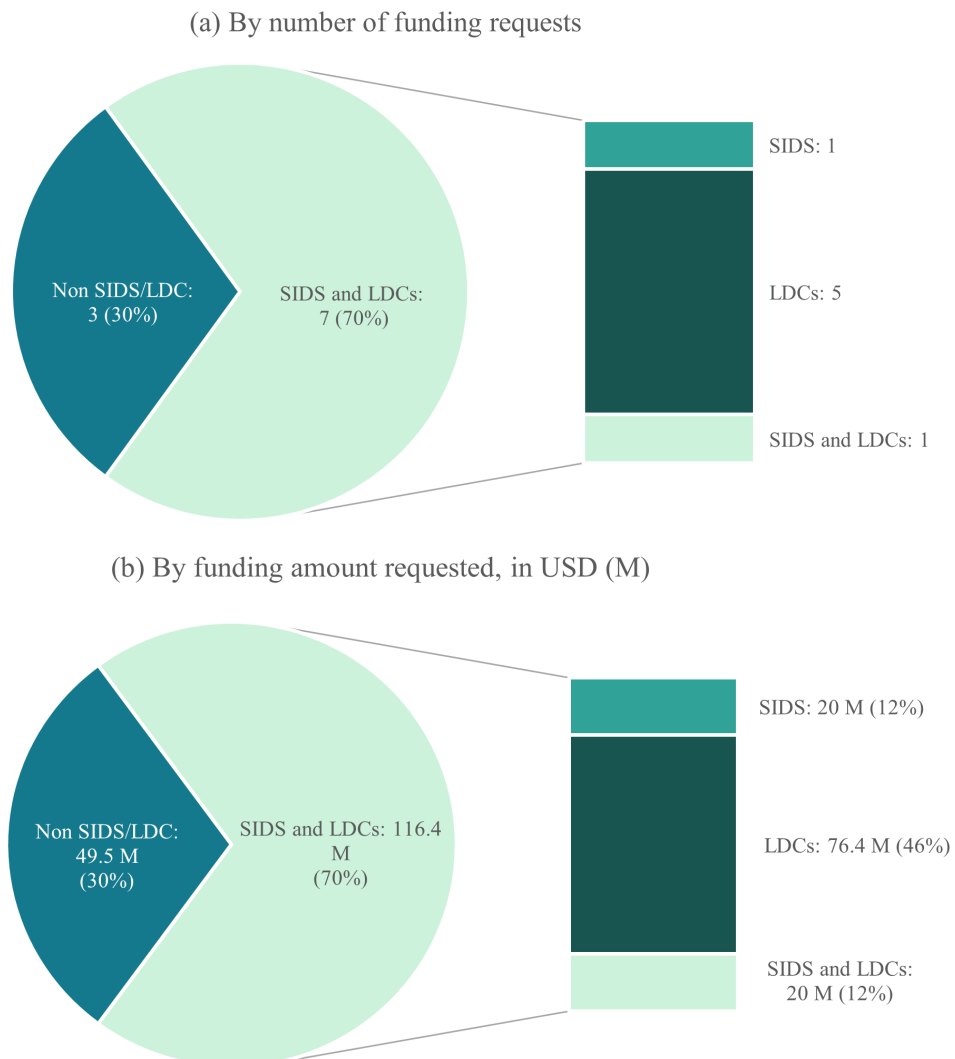
5. The pipeline covers 10 countries spanning three regions (Africa, Asia-Pacific, and Latin America and the Caribbean (LAC)). Figure 1 presents the breakdown of funding requests by region based on the number of funding requests and amount of funding requested.
6. The pipeline is geographically concentrated in Africa, which accounts for five funding requests, followed by three from Asia-Pacific and two from LAC. In terms of funding amount requested, Africa accounts for the largest share at USD 74.5 million, followed by Asia-Pacific at USD 51.4 million and LAC at USD 40 million. No funding requests from countries in the Eastern Europe region have been received.
7. A total of seven funding requests are from least developed countries (LDCs) and small island developing States (SIDS). Five funding requests are from LDCs and one funding request is from a SIDS. One funding request is from a country that is both an LDC and a SIDS (see figure 2).

Breakdown by country group

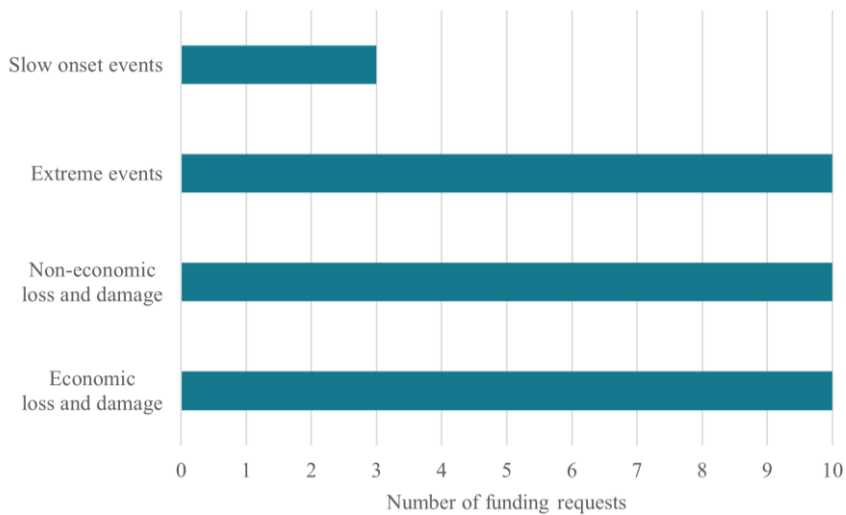

B. Thematic distribution

8. The pipeline covers a range of activities related to responding to economic and non-economic loss and damage from extreme weather events and slow onset events. As presented in figure 3, all funding requests include activities related to responding to economic and non-economic loss and damage from extreme events, of which three funding requests also include activities related to responding to slow onset events.

Breakdown by type of loss and damage addressed by funding requests

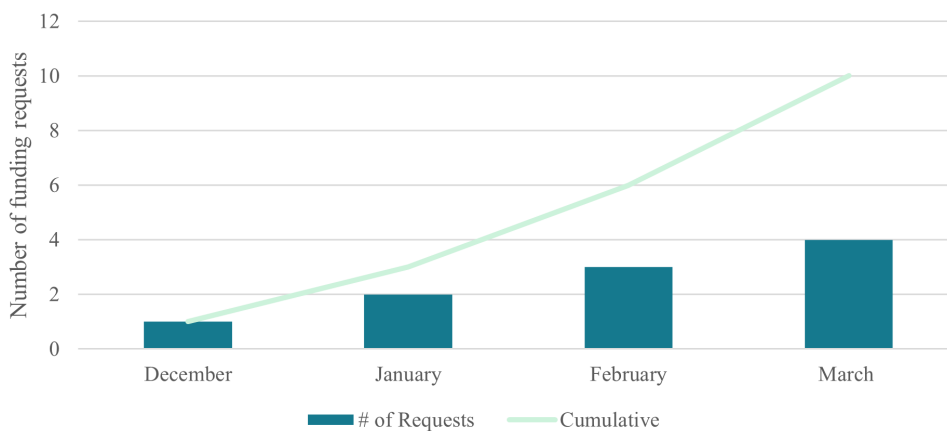


III. Status of the pipeline

A. Submission rate

9. Funding request submissions have followed an increasing trajectory, with one funding request logged in December 2025, two in January 2026, three in February 2026, and four in March 2026, as shown in figure 4.

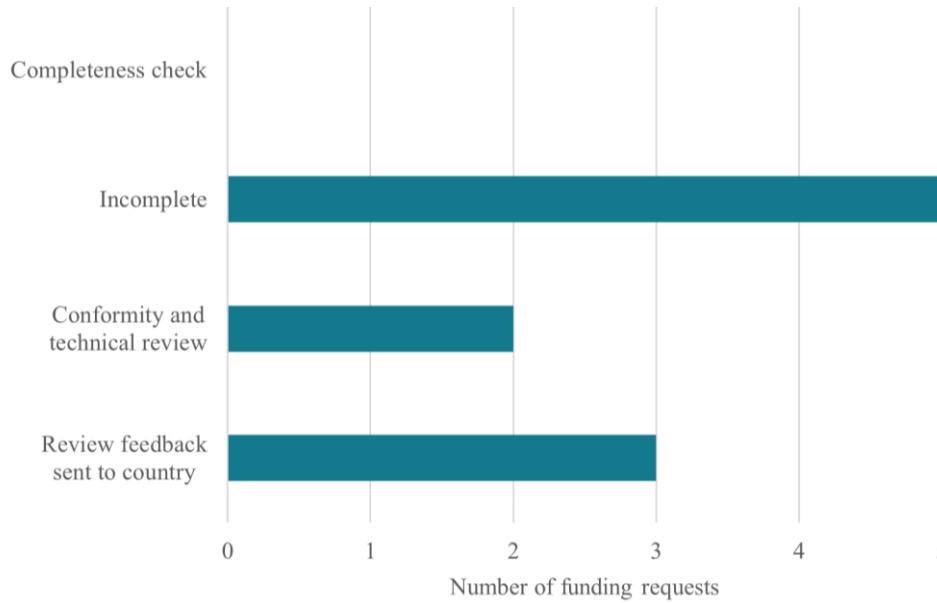

B. Status of review

10. The funding requests are at varying stages of review. Of the 10 funding requests submitted, 5 have been marked incomplete following the completeness check. Three have undergone the conformity and technical review, and the outcomes of the review have been sent back to the countries, with the option to revise and resubmit their funding requests based on the feedback provided. Finally, two funding requests are currently undergoing conformity and technical review.

C. Response time

11. In implementing the funding cycle, the Secretariat is ensuring that timelines for responding to countries and sharing reviews are adhered to in accordance with the adopted BIM funding cycle (decision B.7/D.3). Upon receiving a funding request, the Secretariat conducts the completeness check within an average of 7 business days and the conformity and technical review within an average of 21 business days, which aligns with the timelines indicated in the BIM funding cycle. Once review sheets are sent to countries, they and any access entities (where relevant) are requested to respond and resubmit their funding requests within one month, with flexibility as needed or as notified by the country, in accordance with the funding cycle.
