Report on the status of the pipeline for the Barbados Implementation Modalities

Summary

This document contains an overview of the pipeline of funding requests submitted to the FRLD under the Barbados Implementation Modalities (BIM) from 15 December 2025 to 15 June 2026. It also contains the status of the pipeline as at 29 June 2026.

Expected actions of the Board

The Board will be invited to take note of the document.

I. Introduction

1. In decision B.7/D.3, the Board requested the Secretariat to present, at each Board meeting, a status report that provides an overview of the pipeline of all funding requests submitted, including those that are not presented for consideration by the Board at that meeting and those that did not meet the criteria on eligible activities for funding.
2. This document presents an overview of the pipeline of funding requests submitted to the FRLD under the Barbados Implementation Modalities (BIM) from 15 December 2025 to 15 June 2026. The overview includes information on geographic distribution, country group distribution, thematic distribution and access modality breakdown, as well as details on the status of the pipeline as at 29 June 2026. The list of funding requests is presented in annex I.

II. Overview of the pipeline

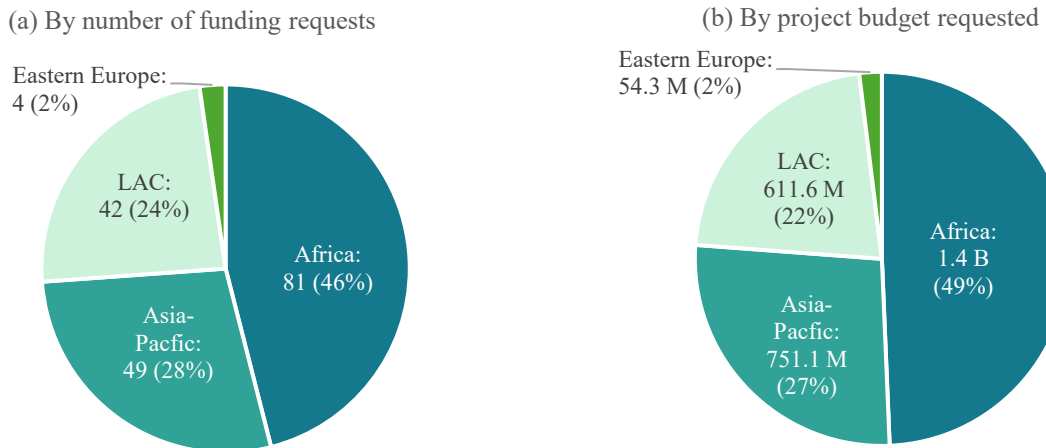
3. The call for funding requests under the BIM was launched at the United Nations Climate Conference in Belém, Brazil, in November 2025 (COP 30), and the funding request submission period was open from 15 December 2025 to 15 June 2026. During this period, 198 funding requests were received, of which 176 entered the formal BIM pipeline. The remaining 22 funding requests were marked as non-compliant and were not included in the BIM pipeline. Annex I contains the list of funding requests in the BIM pipeline. Annex II contains the list of funding requests that were marked as non-compliant and includes the reasons for non-compliance.¹
4. The BIM pipeline represents a combined amount of USD 2.8 billion. The average amount requested per funding request is approximately USD 15.9 million, with a range from USD 5 million to USD 20 million. The average implementation duration proposed in the funding requests is 4.1 years, ranging from 1.5 years to 8 years.

A. Geographic distribution

5. The pipeline covers 119 countries spanning Africa, Asia-Pacific, Latin America and the Caribbean (LAC) and Eastern Europe, with 81 funding requests from Africa, 49 from Asia-Pacific, 42 from LAC and 4 from Eastern Europe.
6. In terms of amount requested, Africa accounts for the largest share (USD 1.4 billion), followed by Asia-Pacific (USD 751.1 million), LAC (USD 611.6 million) and Eastern Europe (USD 54.3 million). Figure 1 presents the breakdown of funding requests by region.

¹ Requests are marked as non-compliant if they do not adhere to the Board-adopted access modalities. These funding requests may be added to the BIM pipeline if the reasons for non-compliance are fully addressed.

Breakdown by region

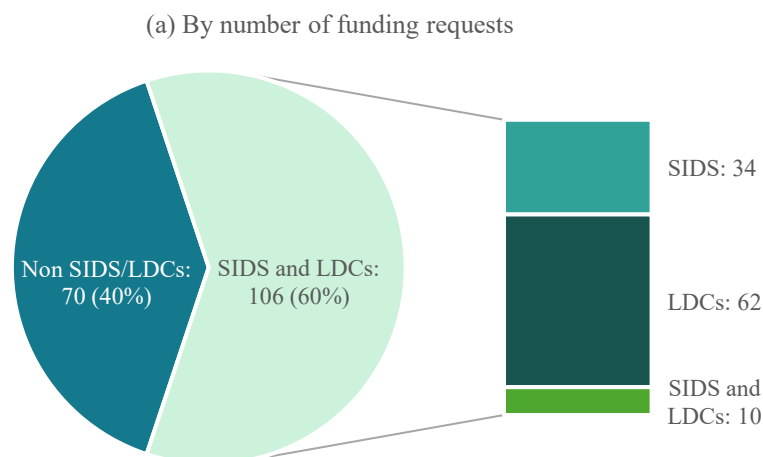

7. The pipeline includes a total of 106 funding requests submitted by least developed countries (LDCs) and small island developing States (SIDS). Of these, 62 funding requests are from LDCs and 34 from SIDS. Ten funding requests are from countries that are both an LDC and a SIDS.

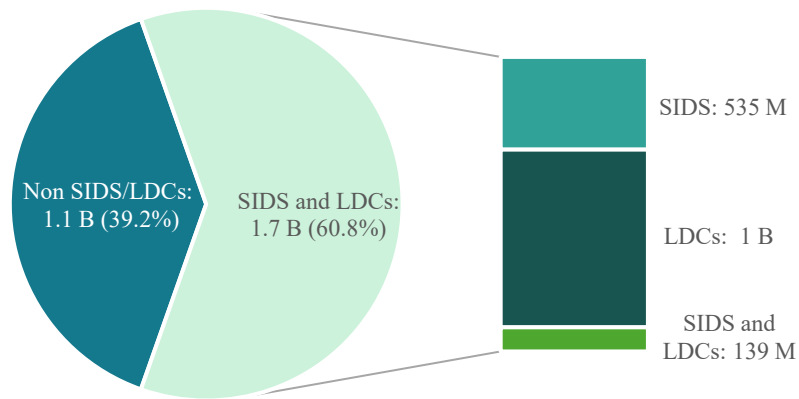
8. In terms of amount requested, SIDS and LDCs account for USD 1.7 billion, which amounts to 60.8 per cent of the total project budget requested² (see figure 2). Of this, USD 535 million is requested by SIDS, USD 1 billion is requested by LDCs, and USD 139 million is requested by countries that are both SIDS and LDCs. Figure 2 presents the breakdown of funding requests by country group.

² Note that several multi-country requests include countries that are SIDS and/or LDCs; however, there is no breakdown of the proportion of budget allocated to each country. As such, this calculation is based on an equal division of the total project budget by the number of countries involved in the relevant multi-country funding requests.

(b) By funding amount requested



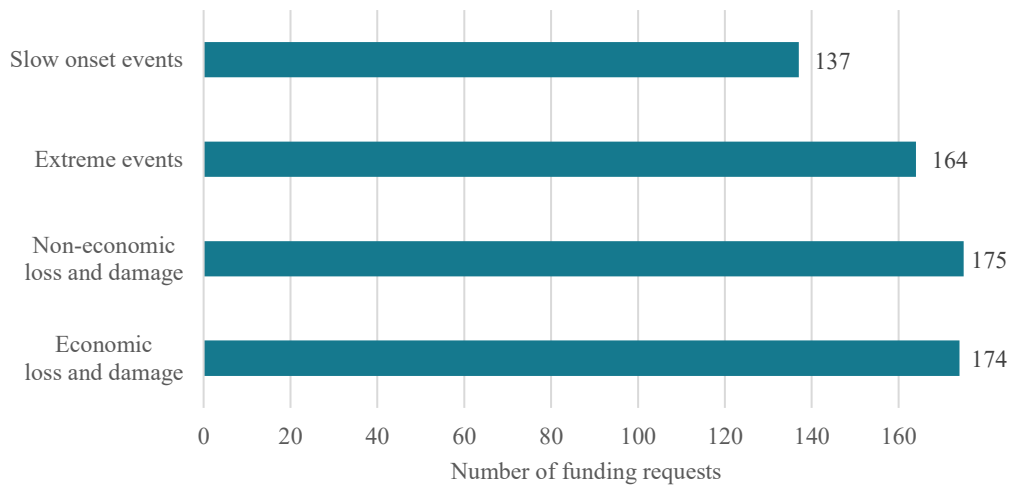

B. Thematic distribution

9. The pipeline covers a range of activities related to responding to economic and non-economic loss and damage from extreme weather events and slow onset events. As presented in figure 3, nearly all funding requests include activities related to responding to both economic and non-economic loss and damage. Approximately 93 per cent include responses to extreme events, and approximately 78 per cent include responses to slow onset events.

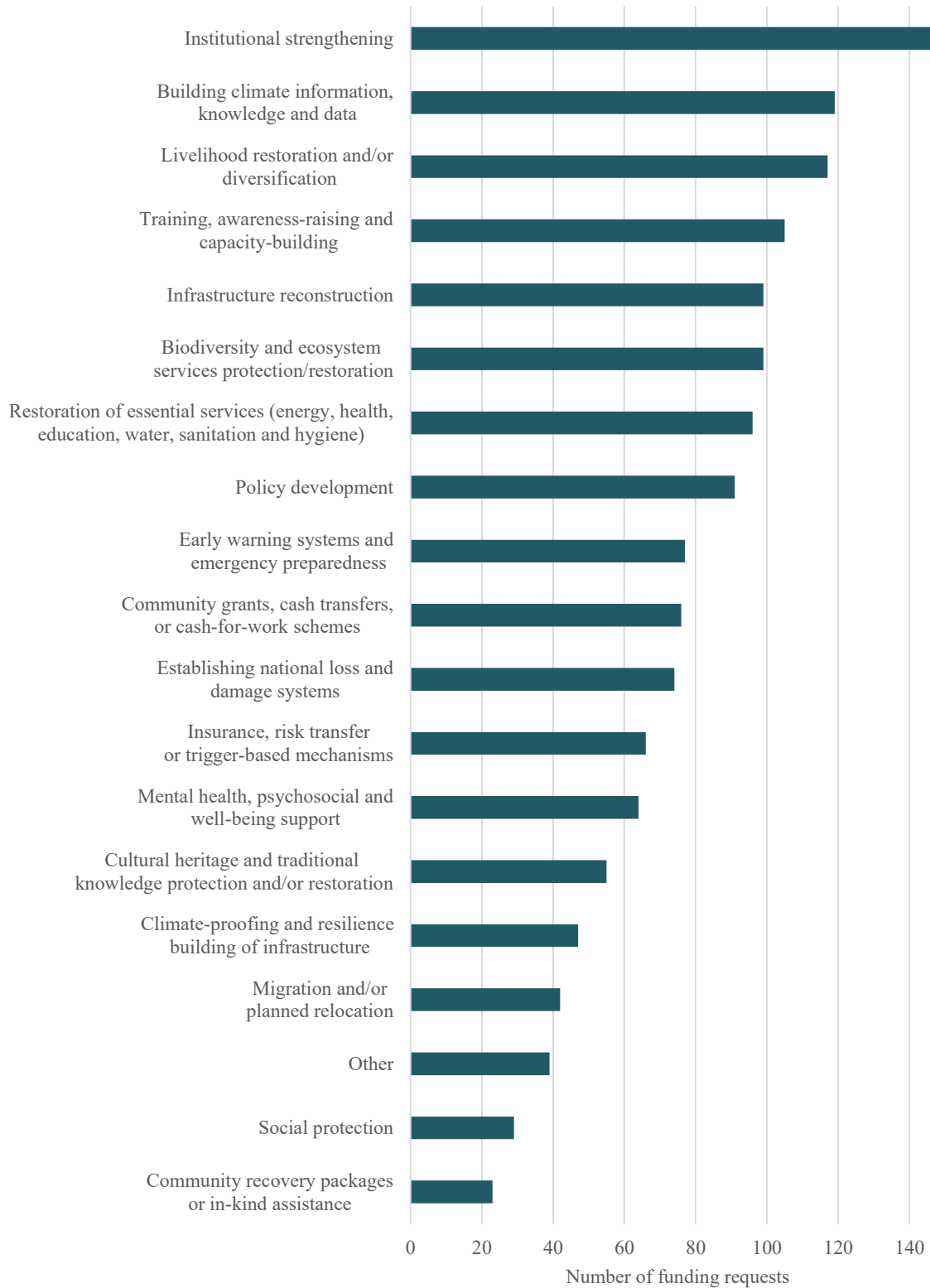
Breakdown by type of loss and damage addressed by funding requests



10. Figure 4 provides a breakdown by types of activities.³ Overall, the majority of funding requests include readiness- and technical assistance-related activities such as institutional strengthening; building climate information, knowledge and data; and training, awareness-raising and capacity-building. Over half of the funding requests also include activities related to livelihood restoration and/or diversification, biodiversity and ecosystem services protection/restoration, and restoration of essential services. Social protection and community recovery packages or in-kind assistance are least-often identified in the types of activities proposed in funding requests.

³ The list of activities was developed through an analysis of the outcomes and activities proposed in the BIM funding requests. The categorization may be updated to align with the results measurement framework for the BIM when it is adopted by the Board.

Breakdown by types of activities^a



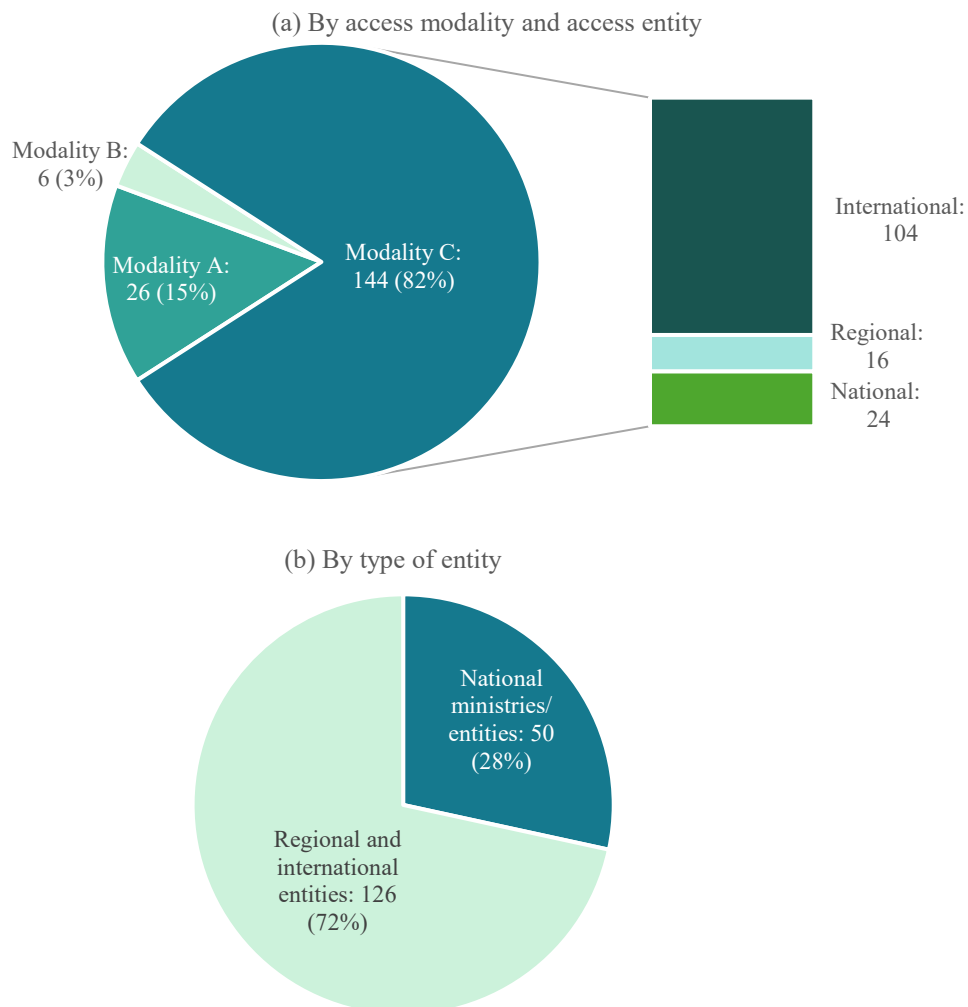
^a Examples of activities classified as “other” include: developing funding proposals and enabling access to finance; enabling social cohesion; and enabling inclusion and addressing the rights of vulnerable communities.

C. Access modality

11. Figure 5 presents a breakdown of funding requests by access modality. The majority of funding requests are submitted through modality C in partnership with entities accredited to the Adaptation Fund, the Global Environmental Facility and the Green Climate Fund. Funding requests submitted through modality A – direct access via direct budget support through national governments – account for 15 per cent and funding requests submitted through modality B – direct access via direct budget support in partnership with multilateral development banks accredited to the Adaptation Fund, the Global Environmental Facility and the Green Climate Fund account for 3 per cent.

12. Of the funding requests submitted through access entities (modality B and C), 107 are submitted through international access entities, 24 through national access entities and 19 through regional access entities. This means that a total of 50 funding requests (28.4 per cent) entail direct access through national access entities and/or national governments.

Breakdown by access modality

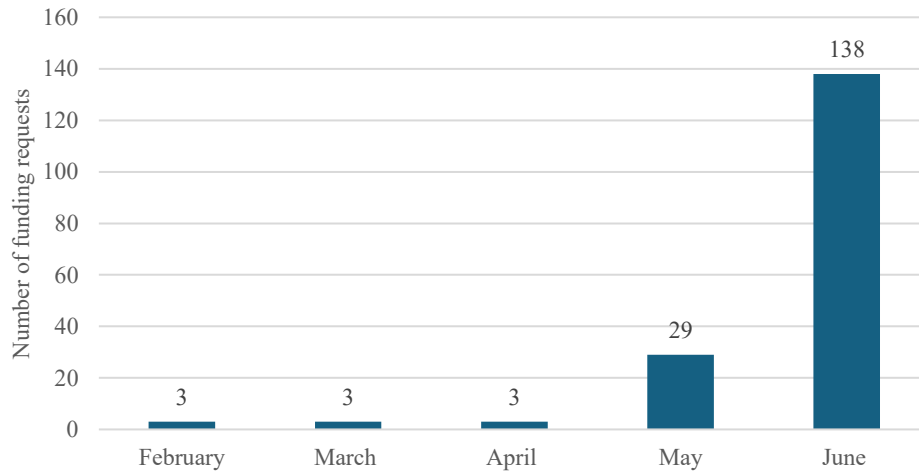


III. Status of the pipeline

A. Submission rate

13. Funding request submissions followed an increasing trajectory, with the majority of funding requests submitted in June. On the last day of the deadline (15 June 2026) alone, 98 funding requests submissions were received.

Submission rate

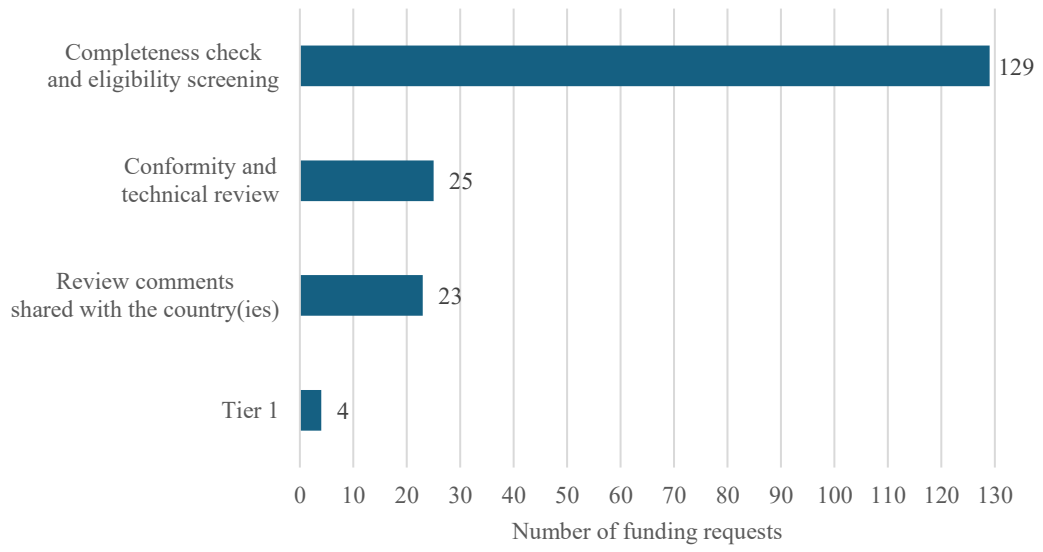


B. Status of review

14. The funding requests are at varying stages of review, as shown in figure 7. Given that the majority were submitted in June, closer to the submission deadline, and noting the current capacity of the Secretariat as well as the review timelines as approved by the Board, a significant number of funding requests remain at the stage of completeness check and eligibility screening.

15. Twenty-four funding requests are undergoing the first round of conformity and technical review, and one funding request is undergoing a subsequent round of conformity and technical review. For 23 funding requests, countries have received review comments, either from the first or subsequent rounds of review. Four funding requests have met the tier 1 requirements as per the assessment methodology for reviewing funding requests under the BIM.
